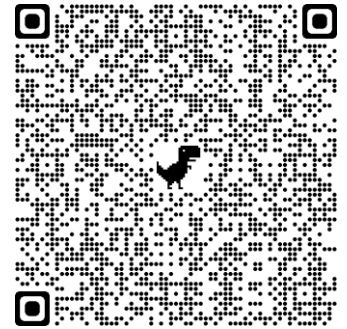
Through the generosity of our school community an amazing total of **£131.00** was raised for Comic Relief. Our donations will help to support people living incredibly tough lives.

The Current National Lockdown Guidance

England is still in a national lockdown. You must stay at home, leaving only where permitted by law, and follow the rules.

You can read the '[COVID-19 Response - Spring 2021](#)' for more information on the roadmap out of lockdown in England.

How the rules will change on 29 March

- you will be able to meet outdoors either in a group of 6 (from any number of households), or in a group of any size from up to 2 households (each household can include existing support bubbles, if eligible)
- you will be able to take part in formally organised outdoor sports with any number of people (outdoor sports venues and facilities will be able to reopen)
- childcare and supervised activities will be allowed outdoors for all children
- formally organised parent and child groups will be able to take place outdoors for up to 15 attendees.
