# **OUR SCHOOL DAY**

The Department for Education (DfE) has recently issued guidance reminding schools that they are to open for 32.5 hours per week.

Playtimes and lunchtime are included within these opening hours.



Currently, Wolviston Primary School is open from 8.40am to 3.05pm, Monday to Friday. This equates to 32 hours and 5 minutes; 25 minutes less than the required hours. Therefore, we need to increase our school day by 5 minutes. We know that many parents & carers arrive at school well before 8.35am and patiently wait for the gate to open. With this in mind, the decision to add the extra 5 minutes to the start of the school day has been taken after consultation with school leaders.

# The gate will open at the earlier time of 8.35am.

The gate usually stays open for around 10 minutes to allow a phased entry; easing conjestion and allowing children to enter their classroom, calmly to get settled and ready for directed teaching. Over the next few weeks, as parents and carers get used to the new timings the gate will close at the usual time of 8.50am. From 3<sup>rd</sup> Oct the gate will be closed at 8.45am, any child who misses the gate will be classed as late and will need to be accompanied to the main entrance. Arrival time will be recorded, and a late code will be marked in the register. The number of minutes, lost to learning will be recorded and presented to parents and carers half termly.
