#### **OUR SCHOOL DAY**

A while ago you may remember a slight change to our school day. After calculation we realise that we need to extend the school day by another 10 minutes. We sincerely apologise that we need to tweak our timings again, but we need to follow The Department for Education's instructions.



School leaders, including governors, have carefully considered several options to make sure these requirements are met. We looked carefully to see which option would have the least impact on our school community. By choosing to add 5 minutes to the start and 5 minutes to the end of each day we can confirm the required 6.5 hours.

#### **School Times:**

**Morning:** The gate will open at **8.30am** for children to be in school ready for learning at **8.40am**.

Afternoon: Our school day will end at 3.10pm.

As parents and carers get used to the new timings, the gate will close at the usual time of 8.45am for a while.

From Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> June, the gate will close at 8.40am.
