



**Dear Parents and Carers,**

**Attendance and punctuality** are extremely important. Research shows those children who attend school **on time** and **every day** are far more likely to achieve their maximum potential. Nationally, all schools must submit their attendance and punctuality figures for analysis. Here at Wolviston Primary we have some improvements to make.

Being part of the [Prince Regent Street Trust](#) we work with, and are supported by, Mrs Pearson from Education Welfare. Parents and carers may be contacted by Mrs Pearson if their child's attendance or punctuality becomes a concern.

Working together we aim to support all families to ensure their child/children gets to school on time and is in every day

For those who may have missed the new timings, our school day is **8.40am - 3.10pm**. **The gate is opened at 8.30am and is locked at 8.40am**. We expect all children to be in school by 8.40am. Many are not and often arrive late.

Arriving at school on time is very important, not only does it set good habits for later life but it avoids any embarrassment felt by the child when they enter the classroom by interrupting learning when teaching has already begun.

In line with government guidance, when we reopen in September we will be introducing a strict recording system to improve our punctuality record. Any child who arrives after the gate is locked will be classed as late and must be brought into the office by an adult. Parents/carers will need to sign their child in to school and state the reason for being late. The number of minutes 'lost to learning' will be recorded and reported to our attendance officer.

**Thank you to all parents and carers who make every effort in getting their child to school, on time every day.**

You maybe surprised to hear that **2,275** minutes have been lost this year due to late arrivals. (That's **6** full school days!)
