## **BREAKFAST CLUB**

Our Breakfast Club provides structured wrap around child care, led by qualified staff who know and see your child in school every day. Parents and carers who wish to send their child to Breakfast Club must book a place. We ask that all bookings are made at least a week in advance, by emailing school so that we can ensure our supervisory ratios are always correct. If a place is required at short notice please e-mail the school and we will try our best to accommodate the request. Unfortunately this is not always possible due to prearranged staffing ratios.

- £5.50 fee for each session, inclusive of healthy breakfast items; cereals, toast, bagels (30hrs child care vouchers are accepted)
- Sessions run from 7:40am to 8.30am.
- Children **must** arrive before **8.10am** (Late entry is not permitted)
- Open term-time only
- Places must be pre-booked, via email a week in advance
- Closed during the school holidays and PD days
- Children are escorted and settled into class after each session.

# **MEASLES**

Earlier this month we alerted parents and carers of the rise in cases of measles across England, particularly in children.

The measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine is one of the routine childhood vaccinations, so most children are already vaccinated against measles. If your child has received both doses of the vaccine, they are unlikely to have the virus.

If you or your child haven't yet been vaccinated, you should contact your GP practice to book a free appointment.

### **SCHOOL ATTENDANCE - DECEMBER 2023**

Attendance and punctuality are **really** important, children who attend school **on time** and **every day** are far more likely to achieve their maximum potential. We monitor statutory attendance and categorise as follows:

Blue - 100% Green - 96.1% - 99% Amber - 93.1% - 96% Red - below 93%

Class 1 - YR	96.03%
Class 2 - Y1/2	95.94%
Class 3 - Y3/4	96.3%
Class 4 - Y5/6	97.12%
Whole School	96.3%

We monitor children who are regularly late to school..
