SATS are just a couple of weeks away and our Year 6 children have worked so hard to prepare for them.
Staff across school, who know them well, are so proud.

SATs don't measure sports, SATs don't measure art, SATs don't measure music, or the kindness of your heart. SATs don't see your beauty, SATs don't know your worth, SATs don't see the reasons, you were put upon this Earth.

SATs don't see your magic, how you make others smile, SATs don't time how quickly, you can run a mile. SATs don't hear your laughter, or see you've come this far, SATs are just a tiny glimpse, of who you really are.

#### **MULTIPLICATION CHECK**

All Y4 children in England will be participating in the multiplication tables check in June. The purpose of the check is to find out if they can fluently recall their times tables up to 12, which is essential for future success in mathematics.

The multiplication on-line check consists of 25 times table questions. Children have 6 seconds to answer each question and the test usually takes around 5-10 minutes to complete.

Parents and carers do not need to do anything additional to prepare their child for the check, but support in practising times tables with your child will be very beneficial.

We recommend all children, across school, continue to practise their times tables. In KS2, when tables get more difficult, children can access Times Table Rock Stars at home.



### SCHOOL ATTENDANCE – March 2024

Attendance and punctuality are **really** important, children who attend school on time and every day are far more likely to achieve their maximum potential. We monitor statutory attendance and categorise as follows:

<b>Blue</b> - 100%	<b>Green</b> - 96.1% - 99%
Amber - 93.1% - 96%	Red - below 93%

Class 1 - YR	96.32%
Class 2 - Y1/2	94.32%
Class 3 - Y3/4	95.1%
Class 4 - Y5/6	94.23%
Whole School	94.87%

The school gate is opened from 8.30 – 8.40am. This is to reduce congestion entering school. Children are expected to be in school, seated at their desk, ready for learning by 8.40am, not arriving. After the Easter break the school bell will sound at 8.38am to encourage children to make their way into their classrooms.

Children have told us that they do not like arriving late to school.

We closely monitor children who are late to school. Where necessary, the Educational Welfare officer will contact parents/carers to support punctuality and attendance.

**Reminder:** Holidays in Term Time will not be authorised Fines are likely to be issued. School does not receive money raised from fines, money goes directly to the local authority.
